Untiring Missionary

Preparatory Reading:

"We cannot be content when we consider the millions of our brothers and sisters, who like us have been redeemed by the blood of Christ, but who live in ignorance of the love of God. For each believer, as for the entire Church, the missionary task must remain foremost, for it concerns the eternal destiny of humanity and corresponds to God's mysterious and merciful plan." ¹

"As heir and successor of the Apostles, the Church is sent to bear witness to Christ and to preach the Gospel *to the ends of the earth* (Acts 1:8). It has the mark of *catholicity*, from which derives its *missionary dimension*. This characteristic has its origin *from on high*, and that origin is part of its mystery.

In the decree *Ad Gentes*, the Second Vatican Council notes, 'The pilgrim Church is missionary by her very nature, since it is from the mission of the Son and the mission of the Holy Spirit that she draws her origin, in accordance with the decree of God the Father' (n. 2). This *mystery* is constituted by the divine Trinitarian plan that is carried out in the Church and shown from the day of Pentecost. This is its permanent possession. The Church in her constitutive reality, in her soul and, therefore, it could be said, in her very *psychology*, has a dynamism that is concretely manifested in preaching the Gospel, in the spread of the faith and in the invitation to conversion proclaimed *to the ends of the earth*. This interior impulse, intimately linked to her mission, comes from the Holy Spirit and, therefore, is part of its mystery. Thus, the dynamism that flows is a distinctive note of the whole Church. In a concrete and effective way, it is reflected primarily by the Apostles who left their homeland to go to remote lands for the sake of the Gospel."²
